## FOR STARTERS

1. Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged you or raised questions?
2. Does your family have a tradition of a fake or real Christmas tree? When do you put it up and decorate? Do you have any fun traditions of food/drinks/movies/activities around that event?

## DIGGING IN

This was the last sermon in our mini-series through Galatians. Take a moment to reflect back and share what God is teaching you about Himself, yourself, and the world around you.

1. How would you briefly sum up the message of Galatians?
2. After reading Galatians 6:1-10, what is included in "doing good"? Did your understanding change after hearing the weekend message?
3. What burdens/hardships can we carry for others? What does that look like in your Life Group?
4. What is the teaching about reaping and sowing in vv 7-8? How would you explain it to a 5th grader?
5. In your own words, restate the meaning of Galatians 6:14. Read Jeremiah 9:24 and 1 Corinthians 1:31. How does this relate to the command to "do good to all"?

## BRINGING IT HOME

1. Where is God challenging you from Galatians 6? What are you sowing/reaping?
2. In a season where the world is telling us to focus on ourselves, how are you seeking to focus on others - both those inside and outside the "family of believers"? If you aren't currently serving on a ministry team, that would be a great first step to doing good to the family of believers.
