Monday, April 6

Psalm 78 | Swapping Miracles

I will speak using stories; I will tell secret things from long ago... We will not keep them from our children; we will tell those who come later about the praises of the Lord. We will tell about His power and the miracles He has done.

Psalm 78:2, 4

Does your home have a new hub? A central place for lots of activity throughout your day? In the Morrison home, our dining table has become the place where *everything* happens. In the morning it's a classroom, office and cafeteria. In the evening it's a cafe, library and game room. Our family's table has become the place for conversation, conflict resolution and counseling.



Your home may be filled with the noise of *generations* - with kids or grandparents close by. Or it may be quiet - just you - reaching out to others through your phone or computer.

Your hub may be your bed, couch, office or garage. All of us have one, and chances are right now it's the place where all of your conversations are taking place.

Psalm 78 asks every believer to add one crucial conversation to the mix - **telling each other stories of God's provision and grace.**

Hubs are where stories are swapped. Military vets swap war stories, coworkers swap office gossip, friends commiserate, lovers compliment. *God's people swap miracles.*

When's the last time you made a list of the miracles God has accomplished in your past?

Here are just a few from my list.

1. *He rescued* my mom from the grip of depression and suicide before I was born.

2. There was one time my dad couldn't afford to fix the car, so he prayed for it and *it instantly started working!*

3. Once, we prayed for God to heal our son when he was in the hospital and *He did.*

I could go on...

The Psalmist reminds us that there is power in our stories. When we don't share them with one another, we forget. Let's not hide God's grace but bring it to the light through our conversations.

Let your hub be a place where God's miracles are told and retold. Tell them to your kids, your friends, your family, your coworkers, tell them to *yourself*. I'm praying that remembering God's goodness in your past will fill you with hope for your future.
